In response to the May 8, 2009 "Order Authorizing Sale of Transmission Rights at Negotiated Rates, Granting and Denying Waivers, Accepting Open Season Report and Accepting Tariff Sheets," 127 FERC ¶ 61,215, issued by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("Commission") in the above-referenced proceeding ("*Order*"), Wyoming Colorado Intertie, LLC ("WCI") hereby submits this informational filing to confirm that at this time there is no plan to interconnect the WCI Project with the Overland Intertie Project that LS Power is developing.

Paragraph 58 of the *Order* provides as follows:

In this regard, we note that LS Power recently purchased Trans-Elect Holdings, the indirect upstream owner of WCI, and that LS Power is reported to be developing the Overland Intertie Project, which is a transmission line that would, as proposed, interconnect with the WCI Project. Our approvals here are based on representations in this application that no WCI affiliates own transmission that will interconnect with this project. To the extent that circumstances change in the future, WCI must promptly notify the Commission of that fact, and address how the WCI project

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continues to satisfy the just and reasonable rate, undue discrimination and undue preference and affiliate concern factors described above.



The Commission's statement that the Overland Intertie Project "is a transmission line that would, as proposed, interconnect with the WCI Project" in paragraph 58 of the *Order* is incorrect. While the proposed eastern terminus of the Overland Intertie Project is in the vicinity of the proposed northern terminus of the WCI Project, and such physical proximity does make it appear on the LS Power Group website's project map (and perhaps other maps showing proposed transmission projects) as though the two Projects may be interconnected, the Overland Intertie Project is not in fact currently proposed to be physically interconnected with the WCI Project. The Overland Intertie Project is currently planned as a radial DC transmission line, without any connection to the existing transmission system in Wyoming.

The plans for the Overland Intertie Project are not yet final. Due to changes in circumstances, it is possible that the Overland Intertie Project could in the future be interconnected with the WCI Project. Consistent with the *Order*, WCI would, at such time, promptly notify the Commission of that fact and address how the WCI Project would continue to satisfy the just and reasonable rate, undue discrimination and undue preference and affiliate concern factors described in the *Order*.
